Notes to the Accounts 31 March 2015

1. Statement of Accounting Policies

These accounts cover the Town Council's full year of operations for the period 1st April 2014 – 31st March 2015.

i) Accounting Convention

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Accounting Guidance Notes for Local Councils (the Guide) issued by The Chartered Institute of Public Finance and Accountancy (CIPFA) as applicable to a medium sized local Council. As a consequence the latest accounting policies, as set out in the Guide and so far as they apply to this Council, have been adopted for the Council's Statement of Accounts.

ii) Fixed Assets

Assets in the balance sheet for 2014/15 are valued on the following basis:

Land and Buildings purchase price (June 2011)

Furniture and Equipment purchase price (or estimated value)

Statutory Allotments actual cost

Civic Regalia professional valuation 2006
Statue and Memorial insurance valuation 2013
Folkestone Collection insurance valuation 2013

iii) Capital Receipts

Capital receipts arising from the disposal of fixed assets are taken to the Capital Receipts Reserve until such time as they are used to finance new capital expenditure. A payment of £12,000 was received from SEEDA in respect of Allotment Land compensation in 2005/06 and was used as a contribution towards essential works at the Tile Kiln Lane balancing pond in 2014/15.

iv) Debtors and Creditors

The revenue accounts of the Council are maintained on an accruals basis in accordance with the guide. That is, sums due to or from the Council during the year are included whether or not the cash has actually been received or paid in the year.

v) PWLB Loan

In March 2011 the Council borrowed £500,000 from the Public Works Loans Board for the purchase of permanent office accommodation. Repayments of £39,301 (including interest) were made in 2014/15. The current outstanding capital amount is £434,223.

vi) Leases

The Council has no commitments under finance leases. Rentals payable under operating leases or contract hire agreements are charged to revenue on an accruals basis.

Contributions to the Kent Superannuation Fund are determined by the fund's actuary on a triennial basis and are set to meet 100% of the liabilities of that fund, in accordance with relevant Government regulations.
